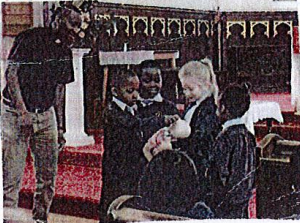

The godparents make the sign of the cross on the baby's forehead.



The priest uses oil of catechumens to make a sign of the cross at the top of the baby's chest.



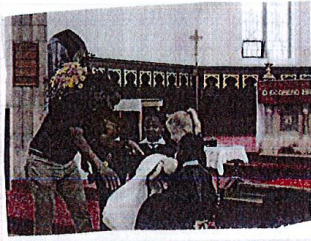
The priest pours Holy water over the baby's head to show that the baby is part of God's family.
