Context: <i>Description of task</i>	<p>Children created an information sheet describing the symbols of Confirmation.</p> <p>Children were given a choice of task but they chose this one. This was an assessment task at the end of the topic.</p>

<i>Level of support provided</i>	None High Minimal Moderate
<i>Resources used to support task</i>	Working Wall on confirmation. Pictures and vocabulary (Images, signs, symbols and Scripture).
Teacher's comments:	<p>The assessment of knowledge of Confirmation is key here. Symbols related to the role of the Bishop (mitre-crozier) are present.</p> <p>Examples presented partially meet the requirements but more explanation is needed and not all symbols are covered.</p> <p>Religious language is being used.</p> <p>These are “developing” pieces of work. They are not fully meeting requirements for the phase.</p>

of people.




Sponsor
