The Sacrament of marriage

What marriage is:

Marriage is a sacrament of love. Marriage lets 2 people to come together and love each other. It is also very important to love each other and be friends for life.

The ring:

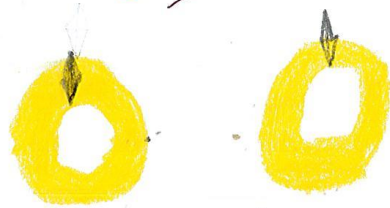
The ring is a symbol of marriage. The shape of the ring (circle) shows that you will love forever and be together forever as the ring has no end or * no beginning. The priest blesses the rings by saying "May the Lord bless these rings which you give to each other, as the sign of love and fidelity." This is a sign of fidelity.

Vows:

The Vows show that the couple are ready to take this responsibility and have commitment to get married. The ^{women} ~~wife~~ goes first saying the promises:

I call upon these persons here present,
to witness that I, (Name)
do take thee, (Name)
to be my lawful wedded, (wife-husband)
to have and to hold,
from this day forward,
for better for worse,
for richer for poorer,
in sickness and in health,
to love and to cherish,
till death do us part.

At the end of the service,
everyone says the our
Father and the priest
prays that they will love
for eternity.
