Then the pupils were given photographs which represented different parts of an ordination. The pupils had to write about the different parts of an ordination and their significance related to the symbols and actions.

## Vianney



St John Vianney's full name is Saint Jean-Baptiste-Marie Vianney.

He was canonized: May 31st 1925; feast day: August 4th

He was born: May 8th 1786, Dardilly France.  
He died (ood): August 4th 1859.

He was forced to make his communion secretly.

He is the patron saint of parish priests

In 1818 he became priest of the small village of Ars

He previously worked in the army he felt called to pursue the priesthood but struggled in Latin.

He was ordained in 1815

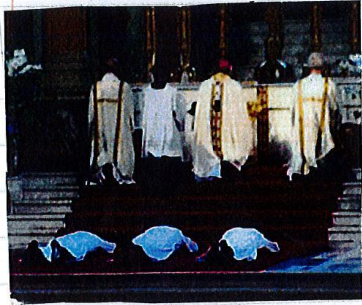
People went to him, as they felt he was easy to understand.

He was sent to Ars because he wasn't clever and they didn't think he was going to be a good priest so they sent him to Ars as it was a small village.

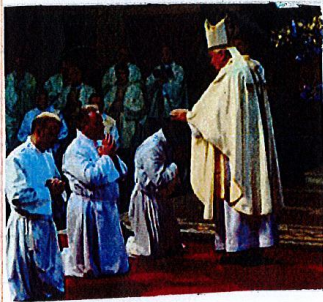

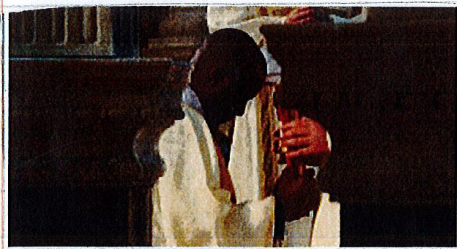
LO: I know what happens at the Sacrament of Ordination.



The first picture is about the Ordination. Laying down, Ordination laying down symbolises that they are ready to put others above them. ✓



This picture shows the "Laying on of hands" the bishop lays his hands on the ordinands and says a prayer which makes the training priests to a official priest. ✓



This is the time the hands are anointed with the holy oil which symbolises his hands are holy and are ready to do god's work. ✓
