Gift

A gift is exciting: unwrapping and admiring it, being glad for the love of the person who gave it, using and sharing it ... and perhaps discovering new skills because of it.

I receive gifts. I give gifts.

I am a gift.

My life is God's gift all the length of my days.
My hands and feet, ears and eyes,
my skills and pleasures are all God's gifts.
When I recognise the gifts of God,
when I own them as mine and use them,
I reflect God, the creator, the lover,
in whose image I am made.

Hildegarde of Bingen described the presence of God, the creator, in poetic imagery:

I am the breeze that nurtures all things green.
I encourage the blossoms to flourish with ripening fruits.
I am the rain coming from the dew,
that causes the grasses to laugh with the joy of life.
All my gifts and skills,
contribute to the eternal celebration of the gift of life.
With God and in God I am bringing to birth the kingdom
of God's glory and peace, justice and love.
Brain-power and muscle-power have a part to play...
but I have to receive the kingdom trustingly, as a gift...
allowing the Holy Spirit to make me a channel
for the compassion of God:
to encourage and set free ...
to reconcile and make new.
