# Family Rituals

What are “Family Rituals”?

Family Rituals are those family routines, the consistent and predictable ways of behaving, that give special meaning to couples and families.

Rituals are a highly condensed expression of family feelings, thoughts and values. Family rituals range from ‘family celebrations’ (celebration days, religious days, rites of passage) to less formal, less culturally defined “family traditions” (birthdays, holidays, visits to extended family), to the most individually defined and consciously constructed “family interactions” (bedtime or mealtime routines).

## **Top Floor of Our House Shared Vision**

### **Created for Love – ‘Gospel of the Body’**

On the Foundation level we talked about the languages of Love. St John Paul II talked about our bodies being a language which tell the story of God’s plan of love. When we consider marriage as the gift of husband and wife to each other we have a deeper understanding of our own bodies. The spousal meaning of our bodies becomes a ‘gospel’ revealing God’s vision and plan for creation. We are created for love.

# Top Floor of Our House Shared Vision

## Love

In order for people to love one another properly, they must first desire what is good for the other person.

Authentic love is not self-seeking, it is always self-giving. In other words Christian love defined:  
Giving versus using.

Love as attraction: recognising the good, the mystery, the uniqueness of another person; seeing the inner and outer beauty of another person.

Love as desire: wanting this good for yourself, to be made whole, to be made complete; desiring goodness and happiness.

Love as goodwill: wanting the good and well-being of another person before your own.

The other is a 'Wedding Service without Mass'

A beautiful way to prepare for your Wedding Day is to go to confession.

# **The Door of our House - Sacrament of Marriage**

## **Readers**

There will be readings from the scriptures. You might like to ask some of your guests to read for you. You can discuss with the priest marrying you what readings you would like

## **Witnesses**

You must choose to adults to witness your wedding by signing the register. They don't have to be Catholics

## **Music and Flowers**

Your choice of music can transform the ceremony, A gift of the beauty of flowers can highlight the day.

# **The Door of our House - Sacrament of Marriage**

## **Photography**

The taking of photos and video recordings needs to be discussed with your priest beforehand.

## **Register of Marriages, and Donations**

Go to your Registrar Office, up to twelve months before your Wedding, not less than fifteen days - Application for a Wedding Certificate

## **Donations**

Catholic Churches usually do not have “fees” for a Wedding. However, a donation for the Church is always welcome
