





PARISH FORMATION – MISSION & EVANGELISATION

PRAYER

Before using the parish resources it is a good idea to start with prayer. Jesus must be at the centre of all our mission and evangelisation efforts: we are introducing people to Him, and He is the one who guides and inspires us in all we do. A very simple yet effective prayer suggestion is to pray as a parish team before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

Here is a suggested structure for a Holy Hour/Half Hour.

This is the usual format for Exposition of the Eucharist outside of Mass. The Blessed Sacrament should be exposed by a Priest or Deacon, but special permission can be given to Extra-Ordinary Ministers of the Eucharist.

EXPOSITION

Begin with an opening Hymn. The Blessed Sacrament is then taken from the tabernacle and placed in a monstrance on the altar.

ADORATION

During this time there could be moments of silence, spoken intentions, pieces of scripture, reflective music and litanies.

The people are blessed with the monstrance in silence.

The Divine Praises may be said.

Blessed be God.

Blessed be His Holy Name.

Blessed be Jesus Christ, true God and true Man.

Blessed be the Name of Jesus.

Blessed be His Most Sacred Heart.

Blessed be His Most Precious Blood.

Blessed be Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar.

Blessed be the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete.

Blessed be the great Mother of God, Mary most Holy.

Blessed be her Holy and Immaculate Conception.

Blessed be her Glorious Assumption.

Blessed be the name of Mary, Virgin and Mother.

Blessed be St. Joseph, her most chaste spouse.

Blessed be God in His Angels and in His Saints.

REPOSITION

As the Blessed Sacrament is replaced in the tabernacle a song can be sung (e.g. O Sacrament most Holy).

God, our loving Father, we thank you for blessing our parishes with all that we need to respond to our vocation to be missionary communities in our localities.

We thank you for all our parish members who, in response to your call, give of themselves so freely to enrich our parishes in the ways of love and service.

We ask your blessing upon us, as we journey together in hope, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Evangelisation: How do we reach out to those who do not play a part in our parish community?


