Explanation of confession arrangements

Scripture Reading - John 8:1-11

Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. At daybreak he appeared in the Temple again;
and as all the people came to him, he sat down and began to teach them.

The scribes and Pharisees brought a woman along who had been caught committing adultery; and making her stand there in full view of everybody, they said to Jesus, 'Master, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery, and Moses has ordered us in the Law to condemn women like this to death by stoning. What have you to say?' They asked him this as a test, looking for something to use against him. But Jesus bent down and started writing on the ground with his finger. As they persisted with their question, he looked up and said, 'If there is one of you

who has not sinned, let him be the first to throw a stone at her.' Then he bent down and wrote on the ground again. When they heard this they went away one by one, beginning with the eldest, until Jesus was left alone with the woman, who remained standing there. He looked up and said, 'Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?' 'No one, sir' she replied. 'Neither do I condemn you,' said Jesus 'go away, and do not sin any more.'

Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.

Have I been vain, proud, selfish or self-seeking?

Have I looked at obscene pictures, films or books?

Have I been involved in any impure behaviour?

Do I help solve problems between my friends or do I cause more trouble?

Do I say bad things about people who have hurt me?

Have I been jealous of others?

Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

Do I tell the truth?

Do I let others tempt me to do things I know I shouldn't do?

Do I honour my mother and father?

Do I swear or use the Lords name in vain?

Reflections

Reflective music playing the background with the following reflections read out a various points throughout the service

- 1) The graces of healing that flow from this sacrament are truly amazing. Jesus said the following to St Faustina, the polish nun who drew the divine mercy on which our form displays are based...

When you go to confession, to this fountain of My mercy, the Blood and Water which came forth from My Heart always flows down upon your soul and ennobles it. Every time you go to confession, immerse yourself entirely in My mercy, with great trust, so that I may pour the bounty of My grace upon your soul. When you approach the confessional, know this, that I Myself am waiting there for you. I am only hidden by the priest, but I myself act in your soul. Here the misery of the soul meets the God of mercy.

- 2) The words spoken by the priests after you have made your confession are some of the most beautiful words in the English language. As he speaks these words of absolution he places his hands over your head and the Holy Spirit heals your soul and take away all sin...

*“God, the Father of mercies,
through the death and resurrection of his Son has reconciled the world to himself
and sent the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins; through the ministry of the Church
may God give you pardon and peace, and I absolve you from your sins
in the name of the Father,
and of the Son,
and of the Holy Spirit.”*

- 3) Lord Jesus, We are gathered here today, as a sacramental community, gathered before You, in your Holy presence.

You are the shining light in the world. Through your life, Your teachings on earth, your death and resurrection, we know the truth! The truth that through YOU we are saved .

Lord, as you prayed in trembling fear , in the garden of gethsemane, you took the cup and gave up your life so that we may live with you forever,

Lord Jesus, Open our hearts, let us hear your voice through your Word, through You Lord! You truly are present, right here, right now in the Blessed Sacrament. We are all welcomed to your banquet, to your Kingdom of Heaven which begins now, the present.

Help us to be open to your mystery, your truth and touch our minds, our souls as we learn to pray, as we learn to connect with You, as we learn to recognize our wrong-doings, as we recognize the sins we think that don't matter, As we learn to recognize the importance of reconciliation, of forgiveness in our hearts. As we learn to forgive ourselves; knowing that we can be healed, cleansed, forgiven.
