Then it will be their turn to ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me."

Jesus makes it very clear that our Faith and good works must go together.

Pope Francis reminds us that everything is inter-connected and as Missionary Disciples we have a duty to respond to the cry and the earth and the cry of the poor. This Stage brings together the themes of Missionary Discipleship, Accompaniment and Synodality.

It is my hope that this Stage is an opportunity for individuals, parishes, schools and deaneries to learn more about the needs in their community and then to prayerfully discern how best to respond, with the resources available to them.

Please keep the Hope in the Future Programme and our Parishes, Schools and Homes in your prayers. With my thanks for all that you do and my prayers for the success of your Parish endeavors.

# SUGGESTED APPROACH

#### Stage 5: Sharing the Hope

"Our parishes and schools already make an enormous contribution to the local community.

The Fifth Stage will place an emphasis on building on existing outreach and resourcing and providing new opportunities for our communities to be a beacon of hope within the local area."

#### Aims of the Stage

Much inspiration for this Stage comes from the writings of Pope Benedict in Deus Caritas Est, 25:

"The Church's deepest nature is expressed in her three-fold responsibility:

of proclaiming the word of God, celebrating the sacraments, and exercising the ministry of charity.

These duties presuppose each other and are inseparable."

Throughout this Stage and beyond, we would seek to equip and support Parishes, Deaneries and Schools to:

- 1) Carry out a reflective process of listening to the needs of their local community.
- 2) Be formed in the Social Teaching of the Catholic Church and respond to it.
- 3) Be a beacon of Hope to their local community through prayer, financial giving, volunteering, advocacy and signposting to existing support.

Stage 5 will be based on the principles of See, Judge, Act and the Pastoral Cycle.

There will be an ecumenical and interfaith element to this work.

Links will be available to Diocese of Salford Social Action Network (DiSAN) members.


The Principles of Accompaniment will be included emphasizing the dignity of each human person.

Parishes may like to work together on projects as families of parishes, deaneries or Council for Voluntary Service (CVS) funding areas.

Throughout this Stage, it is hoped the links between Home, School, Parish will be strengthened with opportunities for our Young People to take an active role.

Parishes will be supported to be as integrative and accessible as possible.

The See, Judge, Act method was first developed by the Belgian priest, later Cardinal, Joseph Cardijn. He used the method with groups of young working women and men to help them bridge the contradiction between the truth of our faith and the harsh realities of working life. This led to the formation of the Young Christian Workers movement.

The method gained the recognition and attention of the wider Church in the encyclical *Mater et Magistra* when St. Pope John XXIII directly proposed the method as a pastoral approach for the Church to deal with the social issues of the time.

The method later gained popularity in the pastoral areas of theology where it became known as the pastoral cycle. This approach is deep rooted within the Latin American Church and has been proposed on numerous occasions by the Latin American bishops as an important pastoral method for the continent. It is no surprise therefore that Pope Francis, himself a former Archbishop of Buenos Aires has pointed towards See, Judge, Act as a method for the wider Church on many occasions. The encyclical *Laudato Si'* is framed by the method and his recent book, *Let Us Dream*, uses a version to look at ways forward for the Church and the world as it emerges from the COVID-19 pandemic.

#### <u>See</u>

The method is always rooted in the reality of what is happening around us. The See phase allows us to be more aware of what is going on around us in our parishes, schools, local communities, and places of work. You begin to look at some of the causes and consequences of situations that cause concern.

#### <u>Judge</u>

Once we have collated the facts, the Judge phase is an opportunity for us to make a judgement on that reality. We do this by applying the Word of God and the teachings of the Church to the situation. We reflect on the Scripture and how this speaks to the realities we have discussed in the See phase.

#### <u>Act</u>

The Act phase compels us to discuss and plan possible ways of responding to the situations described in the See phase. This action can be personal, or group based. You may wish to include others in the action in order to maximise its potential. This takes us beyond a charity approach and allows us to take on responsibility for effecting change.

Taking action that are directly inspired by Scripture and Church teaching we are living out the Gospel and sharing the good news of Christ to the world. In this way the method is evangelistic by its very nature.

The process is always cyclical. The consequences and lessons learnt from actions taken feed into the See process the next time. It is meant to be used as a constant tool for living out the Christian faith in the world. It can be practised alone but is often more effective when used in a group setting so this should be encouraged.

The See, Judge, Act process directly connects with some of the key themes of Pope Francis' pontificate including missionary discipleship, accompaniment and synodality.

Communities are encouraged to foster a culture which does not separate these themes but sees them as a unified vision for discipleship and evangelisation. See, Judge, Act can be seen as a tool that enables us to be missionary disciples in a synodal Church.

These resources have been ordered in three sections to assist with your social activism planning.


Section 1 is the 'See' section and includes resources to help you gain a greater understanding of the needs of your locality.



# Judge the situation in the light of the Gospel

# CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING (CST)

Catholic Social Teaching has been referred to as "The Catholic Church's best kept secret". This treasure trove of wisdom and guidance, rooted in scripture and the Teaching of the Church, is our Catholic lens through which we make sense of and navigate our way through the many and often complex social issues of the world we live in. CST is often challenging and calls us to discern and respond.

You might come across a variety of different wordings and groupings for the key principles of CST, depending on what you are reading or which website you are searching on, but they will usually all encompass the main themes. For ease, we will use the themes from the Caritas In Action resource.

#### 1. The Dignity of the Human Person.

Every human person is created in the image and likeness of God. Therefore, every person's life and dignity must be respected and supported from conception until the end of their natural life. An institution's worth must be assessed on how it enhances or threatens the life and dignity of the human person.

#### 2. Family and Community.

The human person is not only sacred but social. How society is organised socially, economically, legally or politically has a direct impact on the dignity and growth of every human person and community. Our policy making and structures must reflect a **common good** which enables human flourishing. The key to stability of society is the family which must be recognised, respected, supported, strengthened and given its deserved place in society. The Church teaches that everyone has the right to **participation** and play a full part in society.

#### 3. Solidarity and the Common Good.

We are all the People of God, one family, so what happens to one has an impact on all, locally, nationally and locally. At the heart of solidarity is the pursuit of **justice** and peace. Our love for all calls us to work for a peaceful and just society where everyone has a fair share of goods and resources needed for a sustainable life and opportunities for growth and development are offered equally. The dignity of every person is respected. The vision of the Church's teaching on solidarity is the Common Good brought about through each person working for what builds up the whole and not just their own immediate needs.

#### 4. Rights and Responsibilities.

Every person has a fundamental right to life. It is this right that makes all other rights possible. Everyone has the right to food, healthcare, housing, education and employment. We all need to strive and take responsibility to secure and respect these rights for all others both locally and globally.

#### 5. Option for the poor and vulnerable.

Society should be judged on how it cares for, stands with and accompanies the poor and vulnerable\*. Scripture tells us of God's special concern for the oppressed, those suffering from poverty, those forced to live on the margins. The Church calls us to respond to the cry of the poor and put their needs first. This "preferential option" must be in action in our daily lives and reflected in governmental policies.

#### 6. The Dignity of Work.

Work is a way in which we can continue to participate in God's creation. Work gives dignity and purpose to life and must be carried out in such a way that the basic rights of workers are respected. Everyone has the right to productive work, a

fair and living wage and to organise and join a union. The economy should be conducted so that it serves the needs of the people.

#### 7. Stewardship.

The world that God created has been entrusted to everyone and we are responsible and accountable to God as stewards of the earth, His precious gift to us to enjoy and care for. It is in caring for creation that we show are love and respect for its Creator and for all our brothers and sisters. We must recognise the interdependence of all creation for the Common Good through global co-operation and the sharing of resources, to enable everyone to flourish.



# **ENVIRONMENT**

In 1990, Pope John Paul II spoke on the World Day of Peace urging Catholics to regard the natural world as one of God's creations worth protecting. Since then, in his encyclicals Laudato Si and most recently Fratelli Tutti, Pope Francis has called on us to acknowledge the interconnectedness of all things and to care for our common home.



As Catholics and as stewards of the Earth, we share a responsibility to care for our common home and all of creation to ensure a better future for all.

In March 2019, Bishop John Arnold - who is the Environmental Lead for the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales - wrote to everyone in our diocese calling on them to play their part in responding to climate change in small ways. In his letter, he asked us all to 'think global, act local' and highlighted the impact that making small changes in our personal lives can have.

In the same letter, Bishop John announced his plans to transform his home at Wardley Hall into an ambitious flagship project, Laudato Si Centre. <u>You can read more about our Laudato Si project by clicking here</u>.

In 2020, we welcomed our first Head of Environment, Dr. Emma Gardner. Working closely with Bishop John, Emma will lead transformation in keeping with Laudato Si while providing strategic leadership to support environmental practices across our diocese and beyond. Emma will also manage the Laudato Si Centre, working with Steve Burrowes, Environment Officer to deliver programmes for learning, wellbeing and spirituality.

Our environment work is in keeping with Laudato Si', and the seven Laudato Si Goals "bring the whole human family together... for we know that things can change" (Laudato Si' 13).

### FAITH IN ACTION AWARD & A CALL TO LEAD

CYMFED Faith in Action Award (Faith: Service: Reflection)

The CYMFed (Catholic Youth Ministry Federation) Faith in Action award recognises, rewards and celebrates the active faith and service of children and young people in their school and parish. Many young people are doing so much to follow Jesus' example in serving others in their schools and parishes. The Faith in Action Award encourages young people to take that service into their wider community and accept greater responsibility for their faith in action.

The award is for children and young people between the ages of 10 - 18 which has 4 levels:

- 1. Pin At this early stage, young people will begin a journey of **discovering** what it means for faith to be active.
- 2. Bronze Young people at the Bronze Level take the initial steps in responding to their faith, by way of **serving** others.
- 3. Silver This level encourages a maturity of faith which is expressed in terms of **leadership** and initiative.
- 4. Gold The essence of the Gold Award is found in the young people's desire to develop and establish new ideas in terms of outreach and missionary work on behalf of the Church community.

"The Faith in Action Award Scheme is a welcome encouragement to young people to actively develop their relationship with God, to deepen their faith and put that faith into action for the common good. Its strength lies in inviting young people and adults in schools and parishes to journey together in faith and to make a difference in the world around them; so that all might know the joy of the Gospel." (Bishop John Arnold)

#### A Call to Lead

This new Post Confirmation Leadership Programme for young people, 'A Call to Lead', is a collaboration between the Office for Youth Ministry and Young Christian Workers. It has been based on the 'Be the Difference' programme. It creates opportunities for the young people to develop as leaders by exploring the reality around them and striving to make a difference. It enables them to take an active part in the life of their church, school, and community. The Leadership Programme consists of eight units each with three progressive stages for the home, school, and parish.

#### The units are:

- 1. Being Missionary Disciples
- 2. Communication and Listening skills to become a Young Leader
- 3. The Friendship Circle
- 4. Praver
- 5. The Review of Life, The Responsibilities of a Leader
- 6. Tackling Finance and Fundraising
- 7. Parish Youth Leadership Team/Diocesan Youth Council
- 8. Practical Ideas/resources
